## Registrations Open for 2025–2026 Bussing

If you live in town or in Denwood, AB, and would like bussing for next year, please make sure you go online to register before June 15, 2025. Even if your child is riding the bus this year, you will still need to register them for next year. This will help our Transportation Department with their planning and will ensure your child is able to ride the bus next year.

For rural families, if you have a child starting on the bus for the first time, you will need to register them. Children already riding the bus do not need to be registered again.

Moving to another residence? Please note, if you move to a new house, you should contact the transportation department to find out if you need to register again or at the very least update your address or legal land location.

# GRADE 6 PROVINCIAL ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

Our grade 6 students have their first PAT, English Language Arts – Part A, on May 28<sup>th</sup>. PATs start around 9:00 am. Students need to be in class before the exams begin to allow them time to "settle in" and prepare for the day. Parents can help their child prepare by making sure they get a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast the morning of the exam.

**Kindergarten** students will be heading to Greenbelt Farms just outside of Wainwright. Tues/Thurs will go on June 5<sup>th</sup>, and Mon/Wed on June 6<sup>th</sup>. Busses leave at 12:45 pm and return at 3:00 pm. Students need to wear rubber boots.



**Grade 1's** are heading to the Climb Through Time Museum in Paradise Valley, AB, on June 13<sup>th</sup>. Their bus leaves at 9:00 AM and then they return around noon to finish their day at Wallace Park.

**Grade 3's** are going to Royal Tyrell Museum in Drumheller, AB, on May 27<sup>th</sup>. The bus will be leaving WES at 6:45 AM and will return to the school at 7:00 PM

**Grade 4's** are heading to Fort Edmonton Park in Edmonton, AB, on June 20<sup>th</sup>. The bus will be leaving WES at 7:45 AM and will return to the school at 5:15 pm.

**Grade 5's** are heading to Telus World of Science in Edmonton, AB, on June 13<sup>th</sup>. The bus will be leaving WES at 6:30 AM and will return to the school at 5:15 PM.



**Grade 6's** are heading to Hastings Lake near Tofield, AB, on June 2<sup>nd</sup>. The busses will be leaving WES at 7:00 AM. They will be staying the night and returning on June 3<sup>rd</sup> at 8:00 PM.

#### Important reminders for our travellers:

All students going on field trips must have a permission slip signed by a parent. Teachers will contact you if you haven't signed them.

**Please show up 15 minutes before the bus leaves WES** and check in with your teacher. Busses leaving before the school day starts will be parked on the east side in the bus loading zone. Students who miss the bus will not be able to join the field trip, unless other travel arrangements have been made with the teacher prior to the field trip date.

Parents going on the field trips may need to have completed a Criminal Record & Vulnerable Sector check through the RCMP, check with your child's teacher. We have letters for our volunteers that you can take with you to the station that will allow you to get the check at no cost to you.
